Drawing on a full range of decorative arts, from basketry, pottery, painted and paper crafts, carving, spinning, and weaving to dyeing and printing, embroidery, applique, and floor coverings, this book is a joint effort of author Herald and Oxfam, a group of organizations working with traditional artisans to make their work available world-wide at equitable prices. Westerners who have seen first-hand the beauty and diversity of craft production in developing countries will find this study of the traditional crafts long overdue. Those who have not had this experience will have an opportunity to observe these crafts in the making, through an informed narrative and marvelous photographs of the artisans at work.
