You can get help finding your ancestors, and help others in return. Some Societies list their resources on their website. There is also usually a list of events on the site, which includes details of talks given by specialists in their field. Some Societies also offer publications, CD-ROMs and microfiche for sale and these are often only obtainable from the specific Society.

The Society was founded in 1984 and has over 500 members. Their site gives details of their extensive collection of resources, some of which related to England and Wales, that are accessible at their Research Centre and library located in Caringbah. At the affiliate library, it is also possible to order and view LDS films which are records that have been digitised by the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints.

Griffith Genealogical and Historical Society was founded in 1981. They have a comprehensive Library Catalogue of their holdings. Their range of resources is extensive, with items from both Australia and Overseas, including some from England and Wales. They also have a list of Members Interests and information about Griffith and District Pioneer Families.

The Group was established in 1997 to help members who wished to conduct research into their genealogy. Their journal, Holroyd Happenings, is published twice a year in June and December. They do not hold specific information about the surname Holroyd but they do have a Holroyd surname page, which gives details of where you can find information about the surname.

Mid North Coast Family History Group was established in 1985, changing its name to Hastings Valley Family History Group in 1987. It then changed its name to Port Macquarie and Districts Family History Society in 1998. Their site contains an extensive list of resources that are available for access in the Port Macquarie-Hastings Library, Grant & Gordon Streets, Port Macquarie. They also have a list of Members Interests.

The Society was established in 1983. They have an extensive list of resources on their Homepage which includes School Admission Registers for 60 schools in the area, a library of books, microfiche and CD-ROMs, Cemetery Lists and access to Northern Star Deaths, Burials and Obituaries 1940-2010. They also give access to a list of Members Interests.

The Society was established in 1985 to encourage and promote the study of family history and genealogy. Their site gives details of their wide collection of resources accessible at their Research Centre, which is located in the historic old Pyree School building on Greenwell Point Rd Pyree. The resources include those relating to the local area, Australia wide and overseas, which includes England and Wales.

Their website contains details of their wide range of resources which include microfiche, microfilm, books, magazines, maps and directories which are accessible at their Research Room located at the South Tweed Sports Club, South Tweed Heads, NSW, Australia(4 Minjungbal Drive). They also have a list of Members Interests.

This society caters for those who have a convict forebear who had been transported to an Australian colony between 1788 and 1868 and anyone having a special interest in convicts. It has several publications relating to convicts including a CD containing an index to convict movements between 1827 and 1853 - see their web site for details.

Based in Sydney and established in 1932, this large society (over 7,800 members) maintains a large and informative website. It has several special interest groups, including one for London and the Home Counties. The web site includes a text search facility for enquiring on members' research interests.

The society's web site contains a register of members' interests that can be named searched. It also contains a comprehensive list of resources and publications including all the names covered in their publication "Fifty Early Families of Tamworth and District". If you check out the list you will see that the society has several useful resources relating to immigration.

The society has branches throughout Tasmania (Burnie, Devonport, Hobart, Huon and Launceston). The society publishes a set of fiche containing over 110,000 entries for tombstone and memorial inscriptions from 788 locations across the length and breadth of Tasmania - full details on the society's web site.

In addition to the shire of Busselton, this society also covers the surrounding shires of Capel, Margaret River/Augusta, Nannup and other areas of south-western W.A. The society's highly informative web site contains lists of early birth, marriage and death registrations in Busselton and surrounding settlements. It also contains comprehensive lists of burials in cemeteries in Busselton and surrounding areas and listings of names from local War and other Memorials. The site also contains a register of members' interests.
